Do you know about... The British Transport Police History Group?




Railway policing, along with the docks, waterways, and others once policed by BTP, has one of the richest and most diverse of any police history in the country. BTPHG was formed in 2009 to preserve and communicate this history. Without it, historians of the future could not understand the past.

What is history?

Essentially of course it's the people - who they were what they did and what debt is owed to them. We can portray this through service records, photographs, stories, documents and artefacts. Some sixty-eight of our officers have died in the line of duty and at least five were from acts of violence. It is important not to forget these things.

BTPHG is open to all retired and serving members of the British Transport Police. Membership is currently more than two hundred, including a number of serving officers. It costs just £12 to join with nothing further to pay, ever. You would be very welcome to join us - to actively participate or simply to support the Group.
